

## 2015 HOME IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

Federal funds are available for the Home Improvement Program (HIP), a program to provide technical advice and financial assistance to qualified homeowners for a variety of home repairs.

St. Louis County's Office of Community Development, Home Improvement Program staff, administers the program.

An applicant must be the owner and occupant of the property. Gross household income from all occupants must meet established low-moderate income guidelines. Homeowners cannot live in a flood plain and must be current with their St. Louis County real estate taxes. Applicants are added to a waiting list and served on a first-come first-served basis until all funds are committed. To apply, call 615-8232. Funds must be under contract by December 31, 2014.
